Luminaria 2018 focused on 300 years of culture.


The 2018 festival celebrated **San Antonio's Tricentennial** with artwork and performances inspired by the city's history, land, culture and people.


Relationships with these partners continue to grow stronger as Luminaria's annual festival centralizes in downtown San Antonio.


